Highest Biblical Appointed Time (Lev 23)	
Shabbat	The Rest Day created by HaShem (Gen 2:1-3). The 7th Day of the week (Saterday) Lev 23:1-3
Torah Portions	The weekly Torah portion or parashah is a section of the Torah (Five Books of Moses) used in Jewish liturgy during a single week.

Biblical Appointed Times (Lev 23)	
Pesach	Passover (Lev 23:5), commemorates the freedom of Israel from the Egyption Slavery (Exo 14) and the Crucifixion of Y'shua HaMassiah (Matt 27:32-60, Mar 15:21-46, Luk 23:26-54 & John 19:17-42)
Hamatzot	The Feast of Unleaven Bread (Lev 23:6). Leaven or yeast in Scripture represents sin (1Cor 5:6-8). This period of unleaven shows the redemption of our sin through Y'shua HaMassiah who was without sin (1John 3:5 & Hebrews 9:14)
Bikkurim	The Feast of First Fruits, commemorates the fertility of the Land that HaShem gave to Israel (Lev 23:10) and the Ressurection of Y'shua HaMassiah (Matt 28:6, Luk 24:6, Luk 24:34 & John 2:22)
Omer	Counting of the Omer is an important verbal counting of each of the forty-nine days between the Jewish holidays of Passover and Shavuot. (Leviticus 23:15-16)
Shavuot	Festival of Weeks/ Pentecost (Lev 23:15-22), commemorates the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai (Exo 19-24) and the giving of the Ruach HaKodesh (John 14:15-31 & Acts 2)
Yom Teruah/Rosh Hashana	Rosh HaSanah marks the beginning of the Jewish New Year or the Head of the Year in the Month of Tishrei. Yom Teruah - Feast of Trumpets (Lev 23:23-25). The righteous will be called from the Earth to the Temporary dwelling (1Cor 15:51-53)
Yom Kippur	Day of Atonement (Lev 23:26-32) Day of Judgement.
Sukkot	Feast of Tabernacles. (Lev 23:33-36 , commemorates the Shelters HaShem provided for the Israel during their wilderness season as well as the Shavua that the bride will spent with the Bridegroom in the Temporary dwelling.
