For entrance into the Master's Degree Programme, the Candidate is required to have obtained a 4 year, 120 Credit USA (or 480 Credit European) Bachelors (Hon) Degree. The credits for Post-Graduate studies are as follows:

- Masters Degrees: 40 credits USA based – coursework or thesis or a combination of both
- Doctorate: 70 credits USA based – researched based
- Doctor of Philosophy (PhD): 70 credits USA based – researched based
